<u>FIREWORKS SAFETY</u> Scouting America places the highest priority on the safety and well-being of its youth members, volunteers, and staff. To uphold this commitment, the use of fireworks and pyrotechnics is strictly prohibited during any Scouting activity. This clear directive is outlined in the Guide to Safe Scouting, the official safety resource for all Scouting programs.
