



For many of us, it is the time to renew our unit and individual membership in Scouting America. As a reminder, unit and member renewals are no longer the same.



UNIT RENEWAL

The unit Key-3 will renew the Unit in the Organization Manager in my.scouting.org The renewal can be completed 60 days before the unit's expiration. For most units in Greater LA Scouting, the date is September 30. Please renew your units as soon as possible. You do not need to wait until all members are renewed. For detailed instructions on how to renew, please see last month's newsletter or visit our Membership and Unit Renewal web page. All Key 3 Scouters. keep an eye out for your Membership Renewal Information report in your inbox.

Any units chartered by the Catholic Church needs to complete an updated annual charter agreement. Here are some handy links to the Catholic annual agreements:

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

Individual members/families can complete their membership renewal. Your unit can also opt to complete membership

renewals for some or all of its members. You can find the Settings for these options in the Organization Manager. Units can renew their members on the roster screen. Members expiring in September have received emails reminding them that it is time to renew their membership. Please plan how you will handle the renewals this year.

Starting in August, Scouting America will send text reminders to members about upcoming renewals. These helpful reminders will be sent starting 45 days before the membership expiration.

Members whose SYT/YPT training has expired will not be able to renew until the training is complete. Please renew your SYT/YPT as soon as possible to help make the renewal process easier for your Unit.

Members who have not completed the AB-506 requirements will have their membership suspended before renewal. Those members will need to complete all of the requirements before being allowed to renew their membership.

Training Update

The new Trained Leader Requirements (June 2025) from Scouting America are presented in an organized chart detailing required courses by position, their online training codes, and estimated completion times for each section.

CHART OVERVIEW

The leader's requirements chart specifies exactly what training modules are required for different Scouting roles, lists the course codes, and provides both the classroom and online options. Time estimates for each module are included so leaders know how long training will take for their specific position.

SPECIAL NOTES AND ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- ♦ All leaders must have current Hazardous Weather Training to maintain trained status.
- ♦ Some positions (e.g., Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster) require Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) as an in-person component.
- ◆ There are optional classroom equivalents for each online training path.
- ◆ District, Venturing, Exploring, Sea Scout, and Commissioner positions have unique training codes and time requirements, which are provided in the <u>full chart PDF</u>.
- ♦ Youth Protection Training and position-specific modules are mandatory for all registered adults.

Safety Moment - Annual Health and Medical Record

The Scouting adventure, camping trips, high-adventure excursions, and having fun are important to everyone in Scouting—and so is your safety and well-being. Completing the Annual Health and Medical Record (AHMR) is the first step in making sure you have a great Scouting experience.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- ◆ Scouting America's Annual Health and Medical Record (often known as the "medical form" or "annual physical") is designed to help ensure that all participants in the Scouting program are healthy enough for the adventure of Scouting. It is not intended to limit participation but to inform and protect.
- To keep up with possible changes in health status, the form needs to be updated annually or when a participant's health information changes. The record expires in one year.
- The four-part form serves as a single place to document a participant's medical history and recent medical examination. It also provides consent for treatment in the event a participant needs emergency care while traveling away from aparent or guardian.
- Parts A and B should be completed for all participants and Scouting leaders. Part C should be completed by a licensed health care provider (M.D., D.O., N.P., or P.A.) before the participant attends any Scouting event that is longer than 72 hours, such as a summer camp, trek, or multiday excursion.
- The optional "High Adventure Risk Advisory" (formerly known as Part D) needs to be shared with the examining medical provider during the pre-participation examination to explain known health risks for each of Scouting America's four highadventure bases. Additionally, your council may develop a risk advisory specific to your council camps or other properties or events.
- The forms should be maintained by a designated leader. To assure privacy, the forms should be carefully stored and used only as needed to provide for planning and rendering care. The AHMR should not be scanned, stored, or sent electronically except as specifically directed for a Scouting America national event such as the national jamboree or NOAC.
- Neither Scouting America nor the Annual Health and Medical Record are subject to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). A Scout is Trustworthy: Records and sensitive information should be maintained in a private manner.

The National Eagle Scout Association

The National Eagle Scout Association (NESA) is an organization of individuals who have earned the rank of Eagle Scout in Scouting America. NESA's stated objective is "to serve Eagle Scouts and, through them, the entire movement of Scouting." Members of the National Eagle Scout Association further the mission, values, and time-honored traditions of Scouting in your community and our country. The National Eagle Scout Association recognizes Eagle Scouts with awards for leadership, service, and distinctive professional accomplishments, such as the Adam's Eagle Project of the Year, the NESA Outstanding Eagle Scout Award, the NESA Distinguished Eagle Scout Award, and the NESA Distinguished Service Award. Donors are recognized via the NESA Legacy Society. Council NESA committees may devise their own local awards to recognize community service and NESA activities, consistent with their council's policies.



NESA PROVIDES SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are awarded to Eagle Scouts who have shown active participation in school, Scouting activities, and community service, and who demonstrate they understand the fundamentals of service to community, service to Scouting and their character. They should also demonstrate that, if they have a financial need, what distinguishes their financial need from others.

Council Service Territory (CST): A CST is a group of councils geographically located together.

- ♦ One recipient will be selected for a four-year \$50,000 Lawrence S. and Mabel Cooke Scholarship (up to \$12,500 per year for four years).
- → Four recipients will be selected for a four-year \$30,000 Lawrence S. and Mabel Cooke Scholarship (up to \$7,500 per year for four years).
- ♦ One recipient will be selected from each CST for a one-year \$10,000 Lawrence S. and Mabel Cooke Scholarship (14 scholarships total).
- ◆ One recipient will be selected from each CST for a one-year \$7,000 Hansen & Mary Hall Scholarship (14 scholarships total).
- ♦ One recipient will be selected from each CST for a one-year \$6,000 National Eagle Scout Association Scholarship Endowment (14 scholarships total).
- ♦ One recipient will be selected from each CST for a one-year \$6,000 Lester S. McElwain Eagle Scholarship, Robert and Rebecca Palmer Eagle Scout Scholarship, or National Eagle Scout Association Legacy Society Scholarship (14 scholarships total).

NESA MEMBERSHIPS

NESA offers a 5-year membership for \$100 and a Lifetime for \$500. Lifetime members get a special Double Knot to wear on their uniform. If you become a member within 6 months of your Eagle Board of Review, there is a 15% discount on the membership. The cost of Memberships can be provided as a gift to an Eagle Scout, so parents, grandparents, extended family, this is a great gift.

Additionally, you can order materials to hand out at events like peer cards, pencils, stickers and more, to aid in your recruitment process. You can even request yard signs. You can order those items here.







