Local Conservation Service Project Needs Volunteers

Glendora Trails Council is looking for volunteers to help with Glendora Trails Day on Saturday 11/1/2025 from 8 am to 12:30 pm in the Big Dalton Canyon Wilderness Area (2041 Big Dalton Canyon Rd, Glendora, CA 91741). Volunteers can stay for as little or as much time as they would like. Glendora Trails Day is an ongoing twice a year service program sponsored by Glendora Trails Council, the Glendora Rotary Club and the City to help clean up and maintain trails in Glendora. Volunteers are needed to maintain the trails. This service project can generally be counted as conservation service hours for scouts subject to any troop rules. Scouts in the district are encouraged to consider volunteering, but specifically if the scout needs conservation hours. Glendora Packs and Troops have been volunteering for this event for years.



Participants will receive a free commemorative patch and lunch (depending on how long you stay and when the Rotary starts serving) for helping their local environment. Tools for trail work will be provided, but individuals are asked to bring gloves, water, sunscreen and bug spray. Participants should wear long pants, sturdy shoes, and a hat. Youth groups must be supervised by adults. Participants must also sign a release form. Any volunteers under the age of 18 must have a parent or guardian signature on release forms. Release waivers will be filled out on the day of the event. Check in is at Big Dalton Campground. 
I ask that each of you take action and report back on the steps you've taken so we can track progress and close this gap together. Our participants, schools, and one another are counting on it.



Two New Merit Badges

The requirements for the two newest merit badges are now available online at www.Scouting.org. Click on "SKILLS", then click on "Merit Badges", then click on "All Merit Badges A-Z". You will then scroll down and click on "Artificial Intelligence" or "Cybersecurity". The pamphlets for these two merit badges were not yet available on the website at the time this article was published. Be the first Scout in your Troop to earn these merit badges!



ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE MERIT BADGE

The new Artificial Intelligence (AI) merit badge introduces Scouts to the fundamentals of AI and automation through hands-on activities and real-world examples. Scouts learn key terms, explore how AI and automation are used in daily life, school, and work, and examine ethical concerns like bias and privacy. They also investigate deepfakes, practice communicating effectively with AI, and apply their knowledge through a project or teaching activity. Finally, Scouts explore career paths in AI by researching or interviewing professionals in the field.

CYBERSECURITY MERIT BADGE

The Cybersecurity Merit Badge equips Scouts with essential knowledge and skills to navigate and protect the digital world. Scouts learn about online safety, ethical behavior, cyber threats, and how to defend against them using tools like firewalls, antivirus software, and strong passwords. They explore encryption, connected devices, and the risks of public Wi-Fi, while also practicing safe habits like updating software and backing up data. Through hands-on activities, Scouts investigate real-world cyber incidents, participate in cybersecurity challenges, and explore career opportunities in the field.

The Camp card unit fundraiser campaigns come to an end. The SGV 2025 goal was \$72,000 and we raised \$60,390 with 35 participating units.



Safety Moment - Know the Scouter Code of Conduct

On my honor I promise to do my best to comply with this Scouting America Scouter Code of Conduct while serving in my capacity as an adult leader:



- → I will do my best to live up to the Scout Oath and Scout Law, obey all laws, and hold others
 in Scouting accountable to those standards. I will exercise sound judgment and demonstrate
 good leadership and use the Scouting program for its intended purpose consistent with the
 mission of Scouting America.
- ♦ I will make the protection of youth a personal priority. I will complete and remain current with Youth Protection training requirements. I will be familiar with and follow:
 - Scouting America Youth Protection policies and guidelines, including mandatory reporting
 - The Guide to Safe Scouting
 - SAFE Checklist
- ♦ When transporting Scouts, I will obey all laws, comply with Youth Protection guidelines, and follow safe driving practices.
- ♦ I will respect and abide by the Rules and Regulations of Scouting America, Scouting America policies, and Scouting America provided training, including but not limited to those relating to:
 - Unauthorized fundraising activities
 - Advocacy on social and political issues, including prohibited use of Scouting America's uniform and brand
 - Bullying, hazing, harassment, and unlawful discrimination of any kind
- ♦ I will not discuss or engage in any form of sexual conduct while engaged in Scouting activities. I will refer Scouts with questions regarding these topics to talk to their parents or spiritual advisor.
 - I confirm that I have fully disclosed and will disclose in the future any of the following: Any criminal suspicion, charges, or convictions of a crime or offense involving abuse, violence, sexual misconduct, or any misconduct involving minors or juveniles
 - Any investigation or court order involving domestic violence, child abuse, or similar matter
 - Any criminal charges or convictions for offenses involving controlled substances, driving while intoxicated, firearms, or dangerous weapons
- ♦ I will not possess, distribute, transport, consume, or use any of the following items prohibited by law or in violation of any Scouting rules, regulations, and policies:
 - Alcoholic beverages or controlled substances, including marijuana
 - Concealed or unconcealed firearms, fireworks, or explosives
 - Pornography or materials containing words or images inconsistent with Scouting values
- → If I am taking prescription medications with the potential of impairing my functioning or judgment, I will not engage in activities that would put Scouts at risk, including driving or operating equipment.
- ♦ I will take steps to prevent or report any violation of this code of conduct by others in connection with Scouting activities.





