# Nap On Safety

## SUMMARY

- What can you do in 26 minutes to be more alert, make better decisions, and increase your performance?
- Hint: “It’s free, it’s nontoxic, and it has no dangerous effects,” say the authors of ***Take a Nap!***
- *Change Your Life* (Workman Publishing Company, 2006). The answer is in that title: Take a nap!

# GENERAL INFORMATION

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- “Nap on Safely” isn’t the only way to nap, but it sure makes napping simple if you follow the plan:
- How long do you have to nap?
  - Six minutes will enhance memory, 10–15 minutes can improve focus and productivity.
  - The NASA nap (26 minutes) is the optimal time for a performance enhancement of 34 percent and an overall alertness increase of 54 percent.
  - Extend that nap into the 40–60 minute range, and you will likely be groggy upon awakening as you didn’t finish the sleep cycle. Not good if you are already grumpy.
  - 90 minutes of napping can give you a boost of creativity as you finish a cycle. 90 minutes can also top off the sleep you missed the night before.

# GENERAL INFORMATION

- Plan to nap between **1:00 and 3:00 p.m.** to fit the circadian rhythm of most folks. Want everyone to be fresh at your evening campfire? Give them a break from the program and schedule naps from **1:00–3:00** at the next campout or camporee.
- Make sure you have a safe area and set-up. Make your room darker or cover your eyes (using two pirate patches, an eye mask, or an ostrich pillow). Lie down instead of sitting up. Good news for hammock campers: **Hammocks are the best place to nap, as the gentle swaying will help you go to sleep.**
- Set a timer. Remember, 26 minutes is optimal.
- Need a super boost for your afternoon? Drink a cup of coffee BEFORE you lie down. Combining caffeinated coffee and a nap will make you feel invincible. (Of course, this is not recommended for youth; the target audience for this tip is the Scoutmaster.)



# GENERAL INFORMATION

- Napping can't take the place of getting enough regular sleep. But it certainly may help you through the week at Scout camp or make up for staying up late around the campfire with your crew the night before.
  - Napping may also help you to
  - Resist comfort foods and lose some excess weight.
  - Lower your risk of cardiac disorders. Just knowing your nap is coming may lower your blood pressure!
  - Reduce the risk of diabetes by lowering insulin and cortisol levels.
  - Reduce stress and anxiety by lowering cortisol and releasing growth hormones.
  - Combat driving fatigue on a long trip with an emergency nap.

# Den Leader Title Migration

- Named den leader positions (i.e. Tiger Cub Den Leader, Webelos Den Leader, Lion Den Leader, Lion Coordinator) will be transitioned to Den Leader. In addition, Assistant Webelos Den Leader will be transitioned to Assistant Den Leader. Leaders with named den leader positions will be given new positions with the same expiration and end dates and should not experience any changes in functionality with their new position.

# Family Troop Option

- Starting December 15, 2025, a new "family troop" option will be available that allows a single troop to serve both boys and girls. Tested in successful pilot programs, this model provides greater flexibility for chartered organizations, shared leadership, and opportunities for families to scout together. Most troops will continue to be single-gender, but this new option gives communities an additional option to grow membership and enhance program delivery.

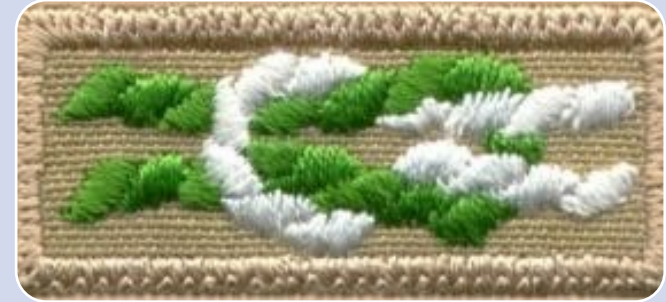

# Den Leaders Training Award Training



- . Complete one year as a registered den leader in the selected position.
- . A Lion or Arrow of Light den leader's tenure can be the program year as long as it is greater than eight months.
- . Attend a Pow Wow or University of Scouting or participate in at least four Roundtables during each year of the tenure used for this award. (Or equivalent approved by the council training chair in advance.)
- . Current YPT

# Den Leaders Training Award Performance



- Do five of the following during the tenure used for this award:
  - Have an assistant den leader who meets regularly with your den/patrol.
  - Have a den chief who meets regularly with your den/patrol.
  - Have at least 70% of your active den/patrol Cub Scouts renew their BSA registration or cross over to a Scouts BSA troop.
  - Take leadership in planning and conducting a den/patrol service project.
  - Have a published meeting/activity schedule for the den/patrol's parents.
  - Participate with your den/patrol in a Cub Scout day camp or resident camp.
  - Complete the Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO).
  - Participate with your den in at least one pack camping activity. For Arrow of Light patrols, at least two pack or patrol camping activities.
  - Take leadership in planning two den/patrol outdoor activities.
  - Hold monthly activity planning sessions with your assistant den leaders.

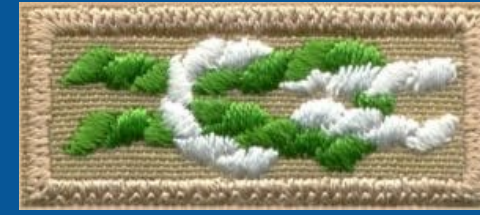

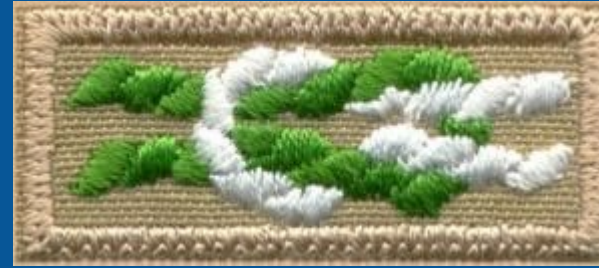

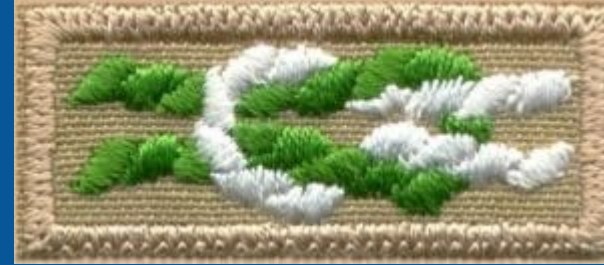

- **Training:**
  - Complete District Committee Position-Specific Training for your registered position(s).
  - Participate in at least one additional supplemental or advanced training event at the council, territorial, or national level.
  - Review the District Operations Handbook, and discuss your role with your operating committee chair, district chair, or district executive.
- **Performance:**
  - Attend and participate in at least six district committee meetings in each year.
  - Be a contributing member of an operating committee that meets council-approved performance objectives for at least two years.

# District Committee Key



- **Tenure:**

- Within a five-year period, complete at least three years of registered tenure as a member of a district committee, serving as the chair of the district or as the chair of one of the district's operating committees.
- This can include the tenure used to earn the District Committee Training Award.

- **Training:**

- Complete District Committee Position-Specific Training for your registered position(s).
- Participate in at least one additional supplemental or advanced training event at the council, territorial, or national level.

- **Performance:**

- Serve in a district that achieves primary council-assigned performance objectives for at least two consecutive years.
- Take part actively in at least twelve district committee meetings. Give primary leadership in meeting an assigned district objective/goal in each year.

## William D. Boyce Award

- As local communities grow, the opportunity to start a new pack increases.
- For those adults who establish a new pack, troop, crew, or ship with a chartered organization, a special silver knot on a yellow, green, and red background is available to wear on the uniform.



## Veteran Scouter Recognition

- After five years of registered service in Scouting America, an adult may, upon application, receive the designation of "Veteran." There are additional veteran awards for every five years.
