Individual sites may be reserved online. Group sites must be reserved via phone, up to a year in advance. There are four group sites in the Sycamore Flats Area (A, B, C, and D) and another four group sites in the Hickey Creak Area (1, 2, 3, 4) which is near the Harmon Equestrian Camping Area. Site D has a shade/rain structure over the picnic tables.

There is a playground, 23 miles of marked trails, and a staffed nature center. Trails are multi-use (hike, bike, horse). Activities for children are available some weekends free of charge. There is a one-mile orienteering (compass map) course, with printed brochures available with instructions that likely meets most of the First Class Rank Requirement 4a. On the Vista Trail there is a BSA Eagle Project at the vista point with labeled viewing tubes pointing out the features you can see when you look through each tube. First 4.5 miles of the Arroyo Trabuco Trail is labeled every 0.5 miles as part of another past Eagle Project.

There are water spigots available throughout the campground. Restroom buildings have showers, and are two-sided (Men, Women). Each restroom has sinks along the wall, with multiple stalls for toilets.

The campground is 3 miles from a Ralphs and a mini-mall shopping district. A fire station is adjacent to the campground. Cell phone coverage is fine since you are surrounded by residential neighborhoods on two sides. While there are individual ADA compliant sites and the restrooms have ADA compliant stalls, the group sites are not labeled as such.

Firewood Policy: Only commercially-produced firewood that has been heat treated to eliminate pests prior to distribution can be brought into OC Parks campgrounds. Campers are required to dispose of non-commercially produced firewood prior to entering the park. Certified "Pest-Free" Firewood will be available for sale at the park entrance.
