General Competition Rules

The decision/scoring of the judges for any event is final. Any member of any Unit who contests the decision/scoring with the judges will cause the Unit to be disqualified from that event. Any scoring disputes shall be taken to the Camporee HQ prior to the OA Serpentine.

Gateway and Campsite Competition: GATEWAYS ARE REQUIRED FOR EACH BEDROOM (CAMPSITE). Every campsite will be inspected and scored.

- "The Incredibles" Obstacle Course: Unleash your inner superhero as you navigate the course! Get ready to test your agility in this camp-wide action-packed patrol challenge. Will your scout skills be as incredible as the Parr family's?
- **"UP" Wilderness Explorer Navigation Orienteering:** Embark on a wilderness adventure just like Carl and Russell! Grab your compass as you navigate through the great outdoors, earning Wilderness Explorer badges along the way.

- **"Brave" Archery Arena:** Channel your inner Merida in the "Brave" archery arena! Test your accuracy and aim for the bullseye as you embrace the spirit of adventure. Will you hit the mark and prove your bravery?
- **"Finding Dory" Scavenger Hunt:** Join Dory on a scavenger hunt. Search for hidden treasures, solve clues, and explore!
- "Coco" Alebrijes Craft: Unleash your creativity with a "Coco" craft session! Make your own Alebrijes, inspired by the vibrant spirit animals. It's a colorful and imaginative craft that will bring a touch of magic to your campsite.
- "Toy Story 4" Forky Craft: Join the "Toy Story 4" crafting fun and create your very own Forky! Get ready to bring this lovable character to life.
- "Pixar Shorts": We'll gather 'round the campfire for some laughter and storytelling! Come prepared to perform your patrol's very own Pixar Short-inspired skit! Bring your favorite Pixar characters to life in a short, entertaining performance for the entire camp! [costumes and props encouraged]

"Ratatouille" Stew/Soup Cooking Challenge: Put on your chef's hat and enter your patrol in the "Ratatouille" cooking challenge! Create a delectable stew or soup using your culinary skills, just like Remy in the heart of Paris. The best culinary masterpieces will be awarded prizes!

And remember - as we toys know very well - everyone must **FREEZE** when you hear "ANDY'S COMING!"

Patrol Numbers: Patrols should not exceed ten Scouts. Units with fewer than 5 scouts may be placed into mixed unit patrols if requested. Host troops will attempt to accommodate requests for mixed unit patrols. Units will provide Patrol roster at registration and communicate any changes at the Saturday morning camporee meeting.

Patrol Flag: Each patrol is required to bring a patrol flag with a Pixar theme.

Patrol Yell: Create a catchy jingle for your patrol yell. The patrol yell should represent the theme of the Camporee and will be given to three camporee representatives that will be identified. The Patrol Flag *must* be with the Patrol at the time the patrol yell is given in order to get the Patrol Card signed off. It must be signed off by three different camporee staff members.

Patrol Spirit: Bonus points for Patrol Spirit can be awarded by designated Camporee Staff for general positive spirit, living the Scout Oath/Law or for uniformity (Field Uniform, Activity Uniform, or themed costume).

Camporee Point Deductions:

- 1. 5 Point Deduction: Units will lose five points if an adult is not identified at check in and does not help at the camporee. If an adult in your unit registers as staff, you have already fulfilled the minimum requirement.
- 2. 1 Point Deduction: Patrols who fail to freeze when designated Camporee Staff alert "Andy is coming" puts all toys at risk, and will result in losing one Camporee General Competition point.

Gateway Competition Rules

This is a Unit Activity. Judging begins at 1:30pm Saturday

Sully and Mike are looking to find your campsite to collect your scream energy, help them with your Monster's, Inc.-themed gateway.

Requirements & Notes for ALL UNITS:

Every Bedroom needs a grand gateway

- 1. No parts may be pre-assembled prior to delivery to the campsite. This is a pioneering project and should be treated as such in your construction. No screws, clamps, bolts, tape or anything other than rope may be used to assemble the gateway. Pixar themed decorations are permitted to be pre-made.
- 2. ALL GATEWAYS MUST BE CONSTRUCTED BY YOUTH ONLY (SCOUTS and VENTURERS). ADULT LEADERS MAY COACH AND OBSERVE YOUTH, BUT MUST REFRAIN FROM ANY CONSTRUCTION OR PHYSICAL ASSISTANCE.
- 3. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place for Troops & Crews.
- **4.** At the time of inspection/judging, the judges will announce themselves. Once announced, all adults and all Scouts except for one adult designee must immediately leave the campsite and remain at least 100 feet away or out of view from the campsite while judging is occurring.

Gateway Design Requirements:

- 1. All gateways must be free standing. No stakes may be used in any form to support the gateways. (In the event of high winds warning (>20 mph), Gateway may be secured with guy lines and stakes for safety)
- **2.** Judging will be according to the gateway score sheet.
- **3.** All gateways must be contained within your campsite area. Guide ropes are permitted for the stability of the structure only in the event of high winds. They may not extend beyond the campsite perimeter.
- **4.** Scouts and Venturers must have a copy of their gateway design posted near the gateway. If not posted in the campsite near the gateway, the design can be stapled or taped to the poles.
- **5.** Structural integrity: When the judges shake your gateway, it must be sturdy enough to withstand a stiff breeze without any supports.
- **6.** Lashings (quality)
- **7.** Ropes Whipped or fused.
- 8. Camp gadgets MAY NOT be attached to your gateway or pre-built.

- 9. Gateways must be completed by 1:30 PM Saturday to be judged.
- 10. Gateways will be judged according to the following scorecard

Camporee Puzzle Patch

Camporee patches will be given to all registered participants who attend the camporee. The camporee patch is designed to be a jacket patch once the set is complete. One portion of the patch will be given out at each camporee.



POLICIES

Fire - Cooking & Light

Only propane stoves. **Fires are not permitted**. Only propane or battery-operated electric lanterns may be used for lighting. Liquid fueled stoves, lanterns and ground cooking is not permitted. Charcoal for cooking can be used in an elevated container.

Uniforms

The Camporee is a uniformed activity for all registered youth and leaders. The uniform affects the appearance of the event and encourages good behavior. Scouts and Scouters are expected to wear their Field Uniforms (Class "A") for the opening ceremony and the interfaith worship service Sunday morning. Activity Uniforms (Class "B") or costumes can be worn at all other times during the Camporee.

Costumes

Theme based costumes are encouraged. No real or metal accessories or simulated weapons are permitted.

Motor Vehicles, Trailers & RVs Parking

Cars, trucks, camping trailers, RVs, and other licensed vehicles are not allowed in the camping areas. Designated parking is across the road from the campsite.

Parking will be in designated areas only. All vehicles must be parked head-out (Backed in). Units will be asked to move all cars, trucks, camping trailers, RVs, and other licensed vehicles that are camped in the campsite or parked head in. All vehicles must display a parking pass which will be issued when the Unit checks-in. If

you need additional passes after check-in, please ask at HQ. **Drivers shall keep vehicle key on their person at all times.**

Restrooms/Showers:

There are portable toilets throughout the designated camporee area. Some portable toilets may be designated for handicap, sex, or age; follow signage for appropriate use. No showers are available in the camporee area.

Waste Water:

No wastewater discharged into the ground. ALL wastewaters must be discarded in a designated drain area or packed out.

Behavior

Conduct and appearance enroute to and from, and while at Camporee will be observed and judged by many people, Scouts and non-scouts. The Scout Oath and Law are the minimum standards of behavior for all participants. Proper conduct and appearance is the responsibility of all participants and especially their unit leaders.

Guidelines

- Registration: Registration must be completed on or before the registration deadline of March 31st. If you are going to attend and are unable to accomplish this, the unit MUST email the Camporee chair before the deadline date.
- 2. At registration close, each unit will be sent a patrol roster that must be returned to the Camporee Chair by April 4th. Each unit will complete the roster for each patrol to identify patrol name, leader and members.
- 3. All attendees (Scouts and Scouters 18 and older) must be registered with BSA (Scouts, Adults and Non-Campers). No guests or other family members are allowed. This means that AB506, fingerprinting and Youth Protection Training must be completed for adults to register. Adults will need to bring their BSA Membership cards or the unit can provide a copy of the current unit registration roster.
- **4. Behavior Guidelines:** Participants are to follow the Scout Oath and Law. Per the Guide to Safe Scouting **The following are prohibited**:
 - Alcoholic beverages, controlled substances (illegal drugs), willful property damage, willful injury to another person or adult interference with any Camporee judge or staff member.
 - No sheath knives, fireworks, or firearms
 - The use of tobacco products is not permitted at Camporee
 - There is a NO TOLERANCE Policy. Violation of these prohibitions will be investigated and reviewed by the members of the Camporee

Committee and the District Executive and may result in immediate expulsion of said person(s) and possible unit disqualification from award considerations.

This is not an all-inclusive list. For a complete list of unauthorized activities, please refer to the Guide to Safe Scouting.

- 5. Toys, Electronics, and Personal Transportation Devices: The following is an example of items that are not permitted at the camporee: Electronic games, toys, radios, DVDs, boom boxes, music devices, generators, personal or unit all-terrain vehicles, Segways, motorcycles, mopeds, skates, wheelies, skateboards, and similar powered and non-powered items. For a complete list of prohibited items, please refer to the Guide to Safe Scouting. Powered wheelchairs and other conveyances for persons with physical disabilities are allowed. Wagons and carts only will be allowed to move equipment into and out of campsites.
- **6. Pets**: Pets are not permitted at the Camporee.
- 7. Wildlife Guidelines: Participants are not to bother any of the natural wildlife found in the camp area. Scouts and Leaders are expected to follow the Outdoor Code. Rattlesnake sightings are to be reported immediately to Camporee Headquarters.
- **8. Trash**: Please plan on packing out your trash. There will not be trash cans available for use.
- **9. Youth Protection**: It is BSA policy that all adults working with youth be current with their Youth Protection Training. Youth should use the buddy system at all times.
- **10. Personal Items:** Please mark all personal items! There are always a lot of backpacks, jackets, water bottles, flashlights, etc. in lost & found which are unable to be returned.
- **11. Extra points**: Patrols will be awarded extra points for being uniformed (Class A, costumed, or matching B).

Pacifica Camporee Rules

- 1. Campsites will be assigned by the unit size and accessibility needs. If you have someone in your unit that needs an accommodation, contact the Camporee Chair.
- **2.** Leave no Trace guidelines will apply at all times.
- **3.** Lights out and quiet time at 10:30 P.M. Friday and Saturday evenings. No further camp work permitted other than late arrivals, who may pitch their tents.
- **4.** Early departure (Saturday night) must be declared at registration.

- **5.** Exit packets will be exchanged at the conclusion of Camporee for your units Exit Survey after the Interfaith Worship Service on Sunday morning. Your campsite will be inspected prior to your unit's departure.
- **6.** Fire regulations require that Scoutmasters notify Camporee Staff of any unscheduled departures.
- 7. Per the BSA Incident Reporting Policy in the Guide to Safe Scouting, all medical incidents other than minor cuts and scrapes, and any unplanned event that results in harm to an individual, property, or the environment must be reported to Camporee headquarters. There will be personnel on staff to assist with any unit needs. Units are expected to provide routine care and distribution of medicine as needed. Any needs that cannot be performed by the unit must be coordinated with the Camporee Staff and Nurse.
- **8.** A. All prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medications be stored under lock (including those requiring refrigeration), except when in the controlled presence of health care staff or other adult leader responsible for administration and/or dispensing medications.

An exception may be made for a limited amount of medication to be carried by a camper, leader, parent, or staff member for life-threatening conditions, including epinephrine injector, heart medication, and inhalers, or for a limited amount of medication approved for use in a first-aid kit.

- B. Medications must be
 - 1. Kept in their original containers; or
 - 2. Labeled and maintained in a fashion approved by the council health supervisor.
- C. Medications must be administered and/or dispensed as follows:
 - 1. For prescription medications, in accordance with the prescribing health care provider's directions or a parent/guardian's signed summary thereof.
 - 2. For OTC medications, in accordance with the original label, except as otherwise provided by the council's health supervisor, or a prescribing health care provider's directions, or a parent/guardian's signed summary thereof.
- **9.** All Non-Campers must go to HQ upon arrival to check in and prior to departure to check out of camp.
- **10.** No one is allowed to open the gate after the guard leaves at 9:00pm to let anyone in. Both the person let in and the person letting the person in will be escorted out of camp.

Camporee Fees:

Early registration is from January 2nd – February 4th. Any registrations February 5th and later will be at the regular registration price.

- **Registration** opens on Tuesday, January 2nd. Registration closes on Sunday, March 31st.
- Onsite Registration on both Friday April 19th and Saturday April 20th with preapproval by Camporee Chairperson.

Check-In

At check-in, you will be required to do the following:

- 1. Turn in a copy of the Unit Roster (Ensure that you also have a roster of your participants). Do not complete the enclosed roster until you are checking in your Scouts and Scouters at your departure location.
- 2. Turn in a copy of the Parental Commitment to Transport Form.
- 3. Turn in a copy of the CALIFORNIA RIFLE AND SHOTGUN PARENTAL/LEGAL GUARDIAN PERMISSION FORM (Bring two copies of the signed form. One to turn in at registration and an additional copy to show to the rangemaster if asked. These will not be returned.)
- 4. Show that you have in your possession the Annual Health and Medical Form Parts A&B for each participant, both youth and adult (these forms are available on the Council Website) Forms must be printed. These forms should be given to the driver in the lead vehicle. We suggest that you also obtain a permission slip from each Scout for your unit to retain.
- 5. Confirm the adult who will help at the camporee.
- 6. Pick up parking passes.
