Advancement Reporting

INTRODUCTION

According to the BSA Guide to Advancement Section 4.0.0.2, "All Cub Scout, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scouts ranks must be reported to local councils. The best and most accurate method is through the BSA's Scoutbook." Units should be reporting advancement monthly to ensure that member records are complete. Missing advancement records are a serious issue since accurate documentation is critical for rank advancement, membership transfers, or membership reinstatements.

All badges of rank, merit badges and Eagle Palms are restricted items. Unit leadership may not purchase these insignia for presentation without having filed a report of the youth's advancement.

Another important reason to report advancement regularly is to be able to produce an advancement report to take to the Scout Shop to purchase your badges of rank, merit badges and Eagle Palms. Note that Cub Scout Adventure loops and pins do not require an advancement report for purchase.

ELECTRONIC ADVANCEMENT REPORTING

Section 6 of the Guide to Advancement provides more information about Electronic Advancement Reporting and clarifies the three methods for reporting advancement to the National BSA database:

- 1. enter data directly into Scoutbook (scoutbook.scouting.org)
- 2. upload data into Internet Advancement (advancements.scouting.org) from third-party advancement software
- 3. enter the data manually into Internet Advancement (advancements.scouting.org).

THIRD-PARTY TOOLS

<u>Troopmaster/Packmaster</u> and <u>TroopWebHost</u> are two of the most common third-party tools that units may be using to track unit activity and advancement. In most cases, units are likely using one of the tools since they existed long before Scoutbook was developed. Both of these third-party tools provide the ability to export a file that can be uploaded to BSA's <u>Internet</u> <u>Advancement</u> system to accurate report advancement to the BSA official database. Directions on how to do this for each tool are linked above.

Benefits of Electronic Advancement Reporting

- Provides straightforward and direct method of reporting
- Eliminates issues with deciphering handwriting
- Helps in local council verification of Eagle Scout Rank Applications
- Records ranks, badges, and awards in accordance with BSA advancement rules
- Consolidates data files to reduce or eliminate record gaps when Scouts transfer units
- Supports national data analysis for advancement statistics
- Helps to assess and support unit success

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Advancement Reporting (continued)

SCOUTBOOK

If a unit is not currently using a third-party tool to track advancement, it is recommended that you give Scoutbook a try. It is a free tool made available by the BSA, and when you use Scoutbook your scouts' advancement, award and activity data is automatically saved in BSA's official database.

Training is available for scouts, leaders and parents of SGVD units by contacting Brian McLaughlin at brian@mclaughland.com. These trainings work really well as online meetings so that they can be recorded and shared with others in your units.

Value of Using Scoutbook

- Scouts and their parents or guardians can track the Scout's progress and confirm the accuracy of the information
- Scouts or their parents or guardians may indicate that a Scout is ready to finish requirements or rank
- Unit leaders are able to keep track of the progress of all their Scouts
- Advancement, awards, and other activities, such as service hours and camping, are promptly recorded
- Leaders enjoy having one place to go on their smartphones, tablets, or computers to track and approve advancement and other information

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Advancement Changes

As of January 1, 2024, the following changes to Scouts BSA requirements become effective.

RANK REQUIREMENTS

There were minor changes to Scout (6) and Star (6).

The Cyberchip has been phased out. Scouts should use the Personal Safety Awareness training at <u>https://</u><u>www.scouting.org/training/youth-protection/scouts-bsa/</u> for both Scout and Star ranks.

EAGLE PALMS

Scouts BSA will no longer have to wait three months between Eagle Palms. They must earn five additional merit badges and live by the Scout Oath and Law.
