

# **The Cyber Chip Replacement**

The **Protect Yourself Rules Preview Adventure**, developed by the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) in partnership with the Barbara Sinatra Children's Center Foundation, is a significant initiative aimed at educating Cub Scouts on how to recognize, respond to, and report abuse. This program is part of the BSA's commitment to creating safe environments



for Scouts and leaders, addressing child abuse – an uncomfortable yet critically important topic for the safety, and well-being of Scouts.

The **Protect Yourself Rules Preview Adventure** serves as a replacement for the **Cyber Chip** requirement for rank advancements, including Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos, and Arrow of Light badges. Cub Scouts can complete this Adventure to fulfill their rank requirement, emphasizing the BSA's shift towards more integrated and practical safety education within its programs.

This Adventure includes age-appropriate video lessons that help Scouts understand the importance of personal safety, encouraging them to identify trusted adults, understand the concept of "safe strangers," and practice ways to say "No!" to uncomfortable situations. Den leaders are advised to review Scouting's Barriers to Abuse before starting this Adventure, ensuring it complements existing youth-protection measures effectively. The initiative not only includes educational content but also encourages feedback from participants through surveys, allowing the BSA to gather valuable data to refine and improve the Adventure based on actual experiences. This feedback loop is crucial for the ongoing development of the program, ensuring it remains relevant and effective for Scouts and their families. The Star Rank and Programming Merit Badge requirements have been updated by substituting the Personal Safety Awareness for the now-retired Cyber Chip. Have you completed your AB506 2-hour volunteer training? Have you done your fingerprinting (Live Scan)? This is the time to have your unit 100% trained. Unit Leaders, where do you rank?

Our District is below average when it comes to being fingerprinted and trained. You can help us reach our goal of 100% compliance with the State requirements. If registered adults have not complied with the law they will be in jeopardy of being dropped from the unit's roster. Don't lose your registration status.

- 2. Get your fingerprinting done!
- 3. Clear any unit discrepancies in the compliance report.
