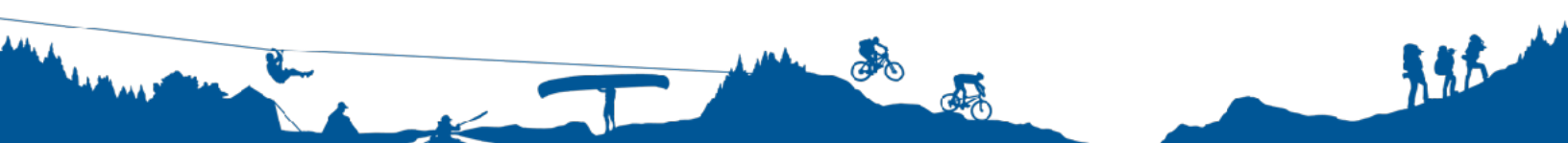

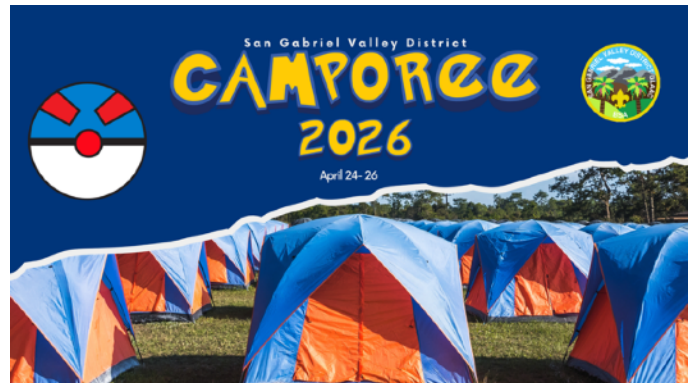


## 2026 SGV District Camporee

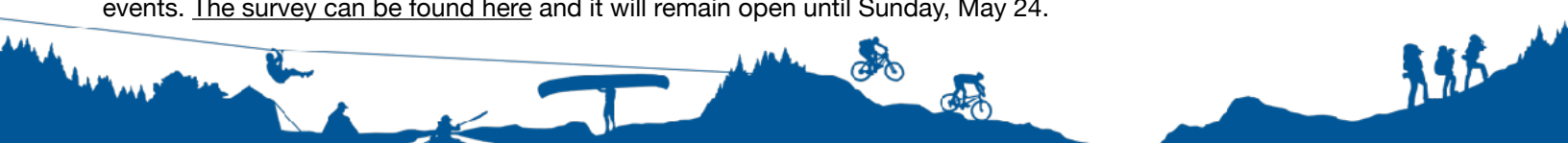


### PATCHES AND RIBBONS

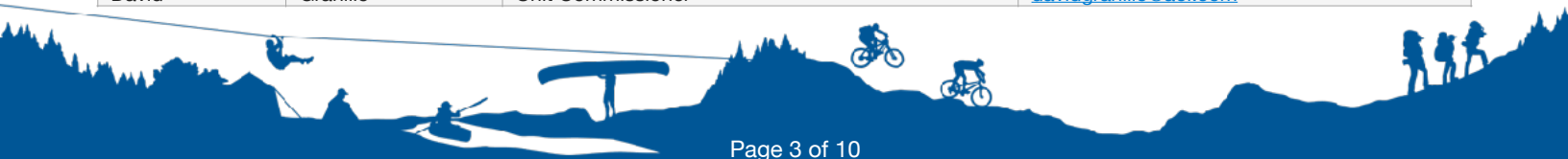
One of the qualities I appreciate most about Doug is his sense of humor—something unexpected from a judge. He always managed to share a clever one-liner, accompanied by a small grin.

## S.A.F.E.

With the upcoming summer camp and summer outing season, now is the time to make safety a priority.



To remain in compliance with Scouting America policies, all adult leaders are expected to complete the following training modules every two years: Youth Protection Training, Hazardous Weather Training, Safe Swim Defense, and Safety Afloat. These trainings provide essential guidance for managing risk, supervising activities, and responding appropriately in a variety of situations we may encounter in Scouting. Scouting America's training guidance also reflects that Youth Protection training is required for adults and must be kept current, and that Safe Swim Defense is valid for two years.

Please also review the SAFE acronym, which serves as a foundation for all Scouting activities:

- ◆ **Supervision:** Qualified and responsible adult leadership is always present.
- ◆ **Assessment:** Risks are evaluated in advance, and plans are adjusted accordingly.
- ◆ **Fitness and Skill:** Participants are properly prepared, trained, and capable.
- ◆ **Equipment and Environment:** Proper equipment is used, and environmental conditions are considered.

If you have already completed these trainings, please verify that they are current. If not, log into your my.Scouting account and complete them as soon as possible. Thank you for your continued commitment to providing a safe and positive Scouting experience.

## Safety Moment - Be Prepared for High Adventure

High-adventure trips are intended to deliver wilderness and learning adventures that last a lifetime. Being both medically and physically prepared for these trips will help ensure they are as safe and enjoyable as they are memorable. While this is true for all Scouts, it is especially critical for adult leaders to be prepared!

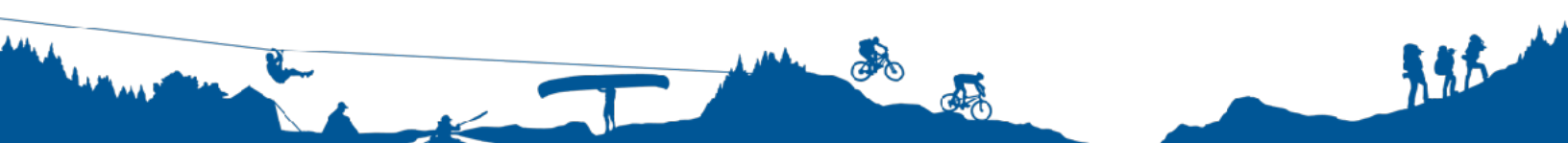

### GEOFENCING OPPORTUNITY

Council is promoting Geofencing to help units increase attendance with recruitment events. If you want to promote events to be more successful submit a request 3-4 weeks ahead of event by [filling out the form this form](#).



### SUSPEND REPORTS AND SAFEGUARDING YOUTH TRAINING (SYT)

#### Suspended report

- ◆ The Suspended report now returns all results within the date range set when running the report.

#### Safeguarding Youth Training (SYT)

- ◆ There is no way to prevent someone from taking the SYT Refresher course if they have not taken the full SYT course. There are links in place that have logic built in to take individuals to the right course. However, once they are in, there is no way to restrict them from going and taking other training courses. I.e: taking the Refresher instead of the full course. If they take the Refresher course first, it will not be counted, and they will still have to complete the full course.

The refresher course does indicate that they have to take the full 90-minute course first. It does this by telling them that if they fail the refresher, they must **retake** the full 90-minute course.

- ◆ The following announcement is found on the MYST homepage:

- ◆ The new 20-minute Safeguarding Youth (SYT) Refresher course is Live.  
If you have not taken the full 90 Minute course, you must take that first before you can take the refresher to get full SYT credit.  
If your SYT is expired for 7 days or more, you must take the full 90-minute course again.  
If you fail the course quiz on the refresher course with less than an 80% on your first attempt, you will be directed back to the full 90-minute course.  
If you took the previous YPT course, you must take the full 90-minute SYT course. Taking the Refresher will not give you credit.  
The course is available in the Volunteer Learn Center in English and Spanish.

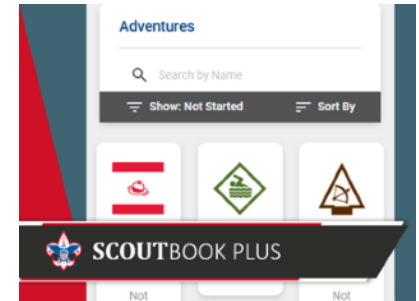

## Scoutbook Plus instructions for Merit Badge Counselors

Scoutbook Plus allows merit badge counselors to connect with Scouts, track progress, and approve requirements online. Counselors can log in at [advancements.scouting.org](https://advancements.scouting.org), use the "MBC Dashboard" to select a Scout, and mark individual or multiple requirements complete via "Quick Entry," including the ability to print digital blue cards.



### FOR MERIT BADGE COUNSELORS (MBC)

- ◆ Access the System: Log into Scoutbook Plus at [advancements.scouting.org](https://advancements.scouting.org) using your [my.scouting.org](https://my.scouting.org) credentials.
- ◆ Connect to a Scout:
  - ◆ Go to your MBC Dashboard and select "Youths", which is the default.
  - ◆ If the Scout is not listed, go to "Add Youth". You will need the Scout's Last Name and Member ID to add them.
- ◆ Recording Requirements:
  - ◆ Click on the specific merit badge alongside the Scout's name.
  - ◆ Click on individual requirements to enter completion dates.
  - ◆ Use Quick Entry to mark multiple requirements as complete at once.
- ◆ Approving the Badge: Once all requirements are met, mark the entire badge as approved on the main merit badge page.
- ◆ Blue Cards: Click "Print Blue Card" in the top right corner to generate a PDF for your records or to send to the unit.

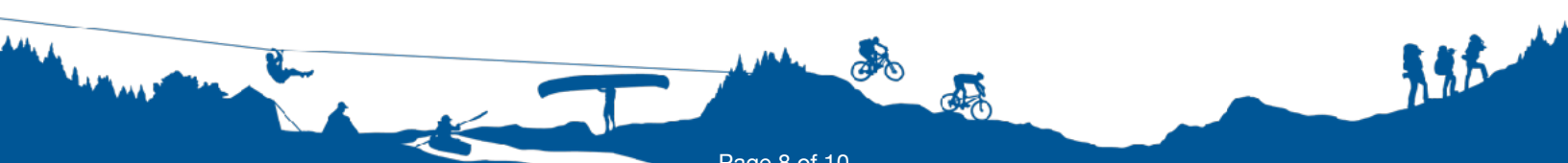
### FOR UNIT LEADERS (TROOP ADMINS)

- ◆ Assigning a Counselor:
  - ◆ Navigate to the Scout's page and click on Merit Badges.
  - ◆ Select the badge, then click Invite Merit Badge Counselor.
  - ◆ Type in the counselor's name and select them from the registered list to send an invitation.

### KEY TIPS FOR SCOUTBOOK PLUS

- ◆ Preferred Browsers: Chrome or Firefox are recommended for optimal functionality, especially when using the Feature Assistant extension.
- ◆ Checking Status: Counselors can click "To Approve" on the MBC Dashboard to quickly approve pending requirements.
- ◆ Partial Badges: The system tracks partials as "Started" or "Pending." You can see which requirements (e.g., 4e) are finished within the platform.
- ◆ Mobile Usage: While available on mobile, the interface can be difficult; it is recommended to use the desktop version for in-depth updates.

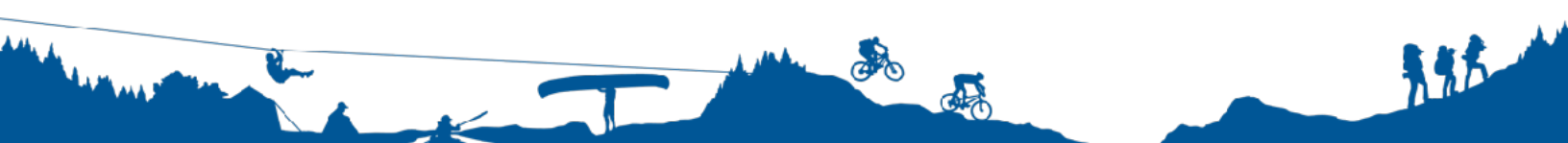
