- **Key Info this Month (Alvin Wong, Martin Cardenas)**
 - Roundtable attendance is open to all Unit, Committee, and future Leaders!
 - EVERYONE - **20-minute SYT (Safeguarding Youth Training) REFRESHER Course is NOW available to take instead of taking the full-length 90-minute course!**
 - Must have taken the new SYT already (YPT doesn't qualify for Refresher)
 - Must take it BEFORE your current SYT expires
 - In your My.Scouting.org account, go to “My Training” -? Click “Retake Course” at the top next to “Safeguarding Youth Training Status” and it should take you to the 20-minute refresher course.
 - **DO NOT** click the round “S.A.F.E. Guarding Youth” logo/badge on the homepage or it will take you to the full 90-minute course!
 - **EACH UNIT is asked to have at least ONE Geofencing Event** - A **FREE** service available to advertise your Unit's event or open meeting in your neighborhood area

- **SUNMMER CAMP = A Must for Youth Enthusiasm to Continue in Scouting**
 - Enthusiasm for Scouting really starts with their first Summer Camp! Help youths experience it sooner rather than later!
 - **Data shows that Youths that DON'T attend Summer Camp (especially during their first year) are more likely to leave Scouting!**
 - Cherry Valley is back! Brand new program, equipment, cots, sailboats, and even mountain bikes!
 - HESR has added more activities to their Summer program. Take a look!
 - Camperships are available to help everyone attend Summer Camp.
- **Order "Scout" (Camp) Cards BEFORE the end of June!**
 - Like last year, order what you feel you can sell as there are no refunds. Order more as you need them. Cards can be ordered up to the end of June but can continue to be sold through the end of 2026.
 - The cards are \$10, and include an offer for \$5 off (per day) at the Scout Shop and there is now a discount for Buffalo Wild Wings too!



- Scouts can now use the 50% of their sales for **ANY** Scout expenses in addition to Camp!
 - Cards are only available through mid-year, can be sold through the end of 2026, and CANNOT be sold at the same table as popcorn.

- **Safety Reminders**
 - **Water, Water, Everywhere - so make sure you have enough to drink!**
 - This promises to be a very warm summer, and DEHYDRATION is a clear hazard of being outdoors!
 - **Hydration Best Practices**
 - Pre-hydrate: Drink $\frac{1}{2}$ liters of water $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 hours before starting a strenuous hike or activity.

- Pace yourself: Do not exceed 48 oz (about 1.5 liters) of water per hour to avoid water intoxication (hyponatremia).
 - Supplement with electrolytes: Use sports drinks or electrolyte replacements during intense or extended exercise to replenish lost salts, but do not use them to entirely replace water.
 - Avoid sugary drinks: Steer clear of sodas, as they can accelerate dehydration.
 - Mandatory breaks: Incorporate mandated water breaks into your activity or hiking schedule at least every 30 minutes.
 - **Early Warning Signs**
 - Be on the lookout for early symptoms within your patrol or group, which include:
 - Headache and fatigue
 - Dry, sticky mouth and extreme thirst
 - Muscle cramps or dizziness
 - Excessive fatigue and altered behavior (e.g., lethargy or confusion)
 - **How to Treat Dehydration**
 - If you or a buddy begins showing signs of dehydration, take action immediately:
 - Rest: Sit in a cool, shaded area and stop all physical activity.
 - Slow Rehydration: Sip on water or a half-strength sports drink. Note: Full-strength sports drinks can cause stomach upset in an already nauseated person.

- **SUMMER Carpooling Guidelines**
- **Youth Protection rules always take precedent and only registered fully trained SPT and AB506 adults may drive other Scout youth.**
 - With Youth Protection in mind, a sole adult may drive Scout youth in a carpool as long as:
 - There are 2 or more Scout youth that are not their own child. If one is their own child, then there needs to be at least 3, (e.g. 2 not their own).
 - The Driver has Part A&B medical forms of the youths they are driving. Recommend having a “Unit Medical Folder” that can be given to drivers at the start and returned afterwards to minimize the effort needed to collect and return individual medical forms.
 - Female Scouts are not in a carpool alone unless the driver is a female adult or is their parent.
 - The Buddy system is always in effect during any stop, and an adult is NEVER left alone with a single Scout who is not their own child.

- **Foul Weather Training (Course SCO_800) (David Tran) – DON'T FORGET!** The (online) training expires every 2 years! Be sure to check your training status and retake as necessary because it is required for outdoor Scouting activities.
 - **This is all the more important given the continuing severe weather and flooding that is occurring throughout the areas.**
 - Log into your My.Scouting.org account, go to your “My Training” page and “retake” the Foul Weather training course to renew the expiration date.

Don't Go Dark This Summer: Grow 10 in June and Get Your \$100 National Charter Fee Covered

Summer is one of the best times to showcase the excitement of Scouting. While other organizations slow down, Scouts are exploring the outdoors, attending camp, serving their communities, and creating unforgettable memories.

Keep your unit active, visible, and growing by inviting new families to join the adventure.

Recruit 10 new Scouts or Explorers between June 4 and July 4, and Greater LA Scouting will cover your unit's \$100 National Charter Fee.

Eligibility Requirements

Any **Pack, Troop, Crew, or Post** in good standing that recruits **10 or more NEW youth members** during the campaign period qualifies.

To be counted toward the challenge:

- Youth must be fully registered between **June 4 and July 4**.
- All registrations must be verified by your District Representative.
- Youth must be brand new to the Scouting program.
- Units must be in good standing.

Important Notes

- Transfers from another unit do **not** count.
- Former Scouts rejoining the program do **not** count.
- Adult registrations do **not** count.
- Only newly registered youth who are verified through official membership records will be counted toward the total.

This challenge is about more than reaching a number. It's about introducing more young people to the life-changing experiences Scouting provides while strengthening units across Greater Los Angeles.

Start inviting friends, neighbors, classmates, and community members today. A simple invitation can spark a lifetime of adventure.

 - Really important to help get new members of a Unit in the door and help them get oriented and integrated into the unit. This includes new Pack families who are bridging into Troops!

 - **Time to Update your Unit's Leader roles and functional assignments (Unit Comm.)**
 - PLEASE Reach out to Estela Chicas with roster, membership, or position assignment problems with the system.
 - Use the Unit Dashboard in My.Scouting.org to updated names in roles.
 - Leaders should take their Position-specific training online at My.Scouting.org.
 - To get access to various Scouting tools in Scoutbook and My.Scouting, Volunteers in new leader roles need to complete an additional adult application with their new "position" in the same Unit.
 - If the adult is registered in another Unit as well, they should complete the form as a "**multiple**" for no additional membership costs.
