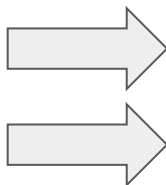

Instructions for Preparing Your Proposal



Meeting the Five Tests of an Acceptable Eagle Scout Service Project

Your proposal must be prepared first. It is an overview, but also the beginnings of planning. It must show your unit leader, unit committee, and council or district that your project can meet the following tests.

1. ***It provides sufficient opportunity to meet the Eagle Scout service project requirement.*** You must show that planning, development, and leadership will take place; and how the three factors will benefit a religious institution, a school, or your community.
2. ***It appears to be feasible.*** You must show the project is realistic for you to carry out.
3. ***Safety issues will be addressed.*** You must show you have an understanding of what must be done to guard against injury, and what will be done if someone gets hurt.
4. ***Action steps for further detailed planning are included.*** You must make a list of the key steps you will take to make sure your plan will have enough details so it can be carried out successfully.
5. ***You are on the right track with a reasonable chance for a positive experience.***

“While a Life Scout, plan, develop, and give leadership to others in a service project helpful to any religious institution, any school, or your community. (The project must benefit an organization other than Scouting America.) A project proposal must be approved by the organization benefiting from the effort, your unit leader and unit committee, and the council or district before you start.”

“Others” means at least two people besides the Scout. Helpers may be involved in Scouting or not, and of any age appropriate for the work.”

“Councils, districts, and units must not establish requirements for the number of people led, or the makeup, or for time worked on a project. They must not expect Scouts from different backgrounds, with different experiences and different needs, all to work toward a particular standard. The Eagle Scout service project is an individualized experience.”

Eagle Scout requirement 11 says you must "plan" and "develop" your service project. Though this project plan is a tool for your use, and is not approved or signed, it is important in helping to show you have done the required planning and development. You should take this project plan with you to your Eagle Scout board of review. Note: You are not required to provide more details than are necessary for the accomplishment of your project.

A Scout who is prepared will complete the project plan, and then review it with the designated project coach before carrying out the project. The council or district representative who approved your project may have agreed to serve as your project coach, or someone else may be designated to take this important role. A project coach's involvement and review of your project plan is optional, but it can help you avoid many problems or mistakes. This can also improve your chances of passing the Eagle Scout board of review.

You should also show your project plan to your beneficiary prior to carrying out the project. This will help ensure your plans agree with the beneficiary's expectations. Remember, the project beneficiary has the authority to require and approve a project plan. Be sure to read "Navigating the Eagle Scout Service Project" at the end of the workbook.

Before the 18th Birthday

It is best practice to have a paperwork meeting before the birthday to check all dates on the Eagle Scout application

Paperwork (“Eagle Binder”) **must be submitted** electronically to the district Advancement Chair *by the unit* **within two weeks** of the 18th birthday

Steps leading up to the Board of Review

- Complete requirements 1-6
- Request the reference letters
- Verify the paperwork (Eagle “binder”)
- Schedule the Board of Review
- Hold the Board of Review



Eagle Scout Board of Review

Reference Letters



Four must be requested, more can be

- Need to complete all requested information on the application
- Can be requested by Scout, Family, Troop or District
- Must be returned to Troop or District (not Scout!)
- Should be on paper and returned in a sealed envelope
(Email is still discouraged in the Guide to Advancement)
- Reference letters are seen only by the members of the Board
- Board may be held 1 month after letters requested
- Board must be held within 2 years from 18th birthday

AGE REQUIREMENT ELIGIBILITY. Merit badges, badges of rank, and Eagle Palms may only be earned by registered Scouts, and qualified Venturers and Sea Scouts. They may earn these awards until their 18th birthday. Any Venturer or Sea Scout who achieved the First Class rank in a Scout troop or as a Lone Scout may continue working for the Star, Life, and Eagle Scout ranks and Eagle Palms while registered as a Venturer or Sea Scout up to their 18th birthday.

Scouts, Venturers, and Sea Scouts who have completed all requirements prior to their 18th birthday may be reviewed within 24 months after that date with no explanation. Refer to the *Guide to Advancement*, No. 33088, section 8.0.3.1, for boards of review beyond that period.

This varies widely between Districts. For the Rose Bowl District the District Eagle Advisor assigned to the unit coordinates with the Unit Leaders to find a date that works for all parties involved



Eagle Board of Review



The Eagle Board will have a minimum of three members (not more than six) and be chaired by the District Eagle Advisor assigned to the unit

Unit leaders and assistants shall not serve on a board of review for a Scout in their own unit. Parents, guardians, or relatives shall not serve on a board for their child.

The candidate or the candidate's parent(s) or guardian(s), or relative(s) shall have no part in selecting any board of review members. (Guide to Advancement section 8.0.0.3)



Eagle Board of Review



- Eagle board of review discussion with the Scout generally last about 30 minutes. This is the highest rank a Scout may achieve; there should be a discussion of the Scout's successes, experiences, and future plans, but rarely should the discussion with the Scout last longer than 45 minutes
- In the Rose Bowl District, most board of reviews including introductions, a brief parent discussion, board discussion with the Scout and a summary with all present; will take less than 1.5 hours
- At the end, the Board will render their decision and it must be unanimous



Eagle Board of Review



- Submission of the final paperwork to the council registrar, is the **responsibility of the Unit Leaders**, with the necessary signed documents provided by the District Eagle Advisor
- Submit: Eagle Scout Application, Unit Advancement Report, and GLAAC Eagle Check list
